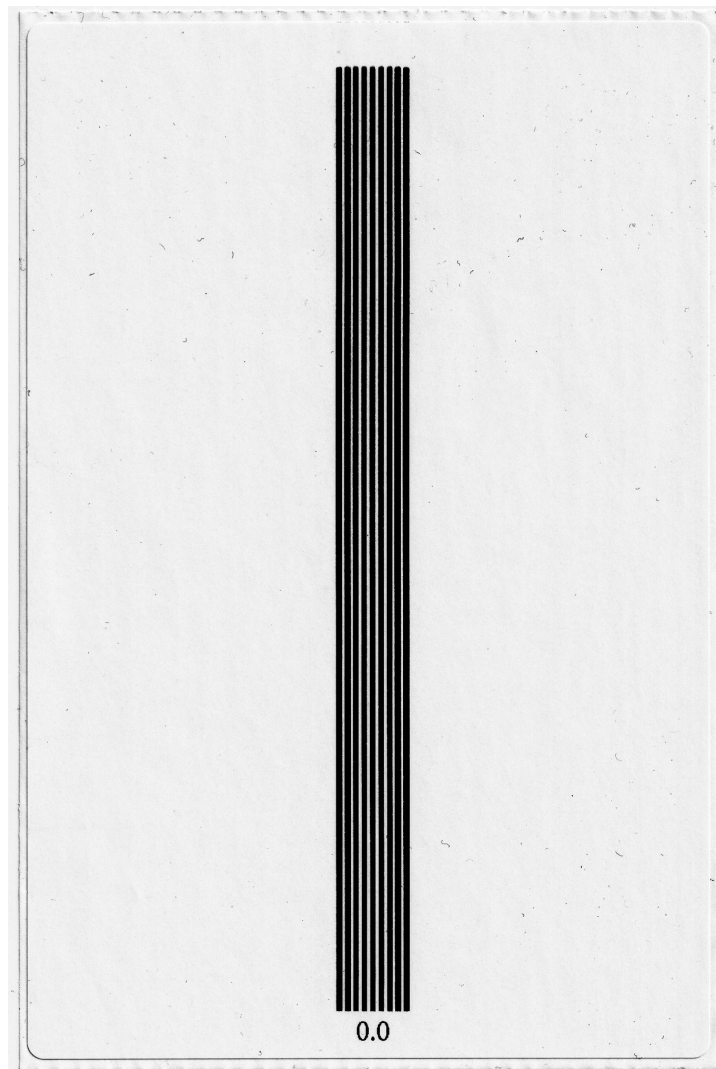


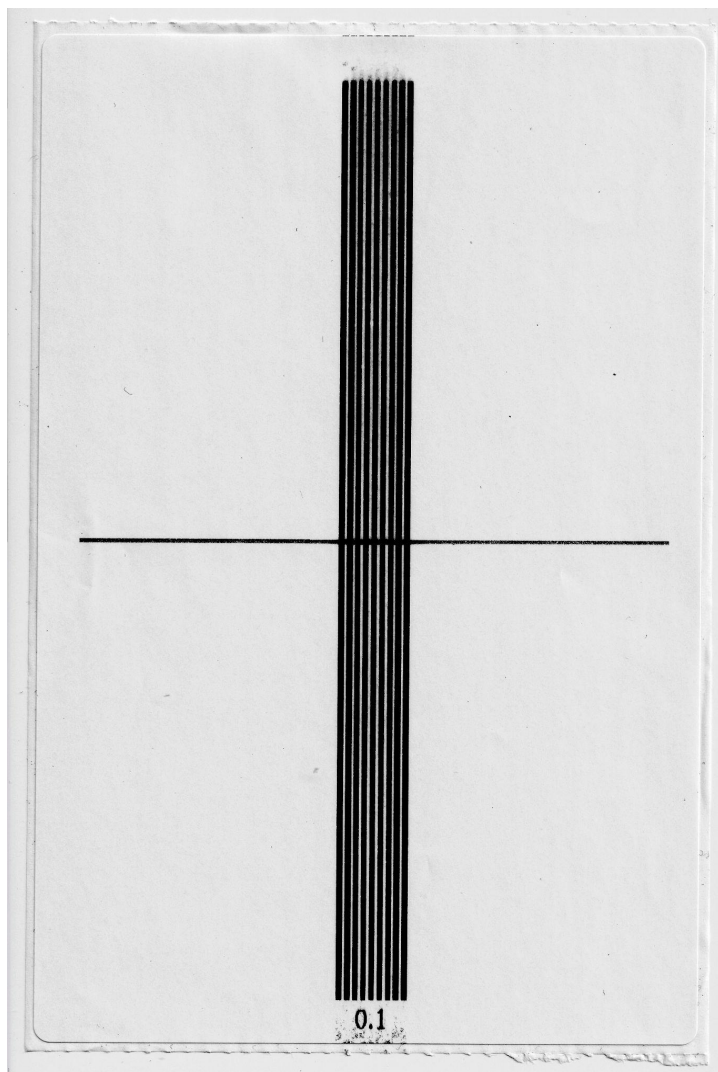
**#26 : SIGNALS.**

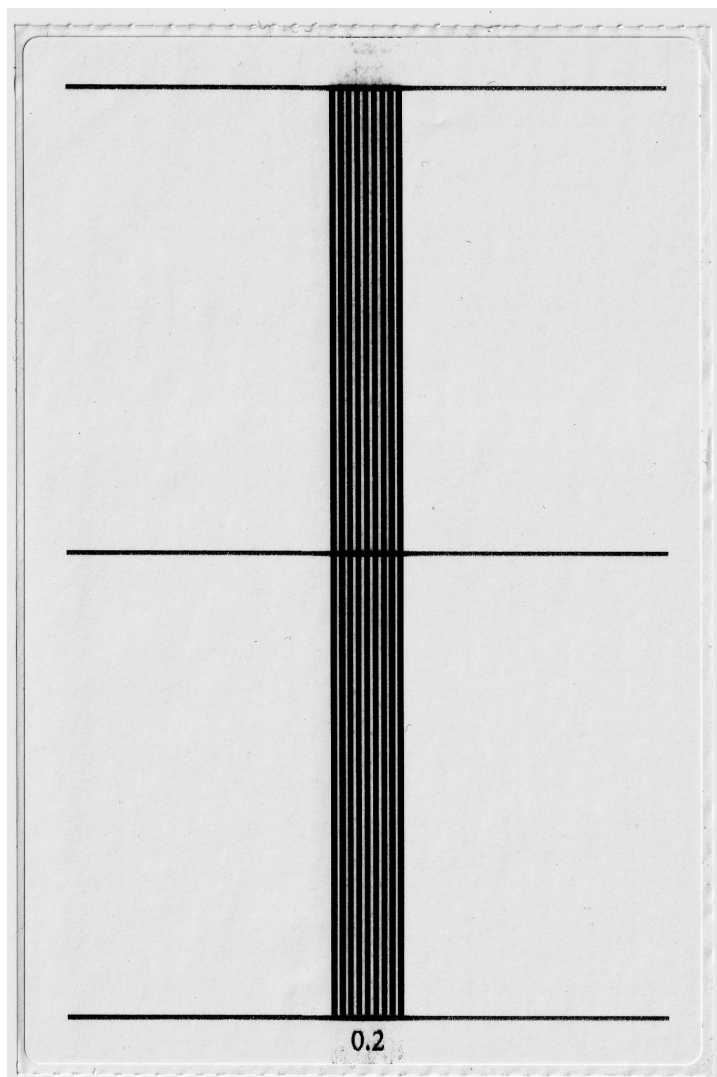
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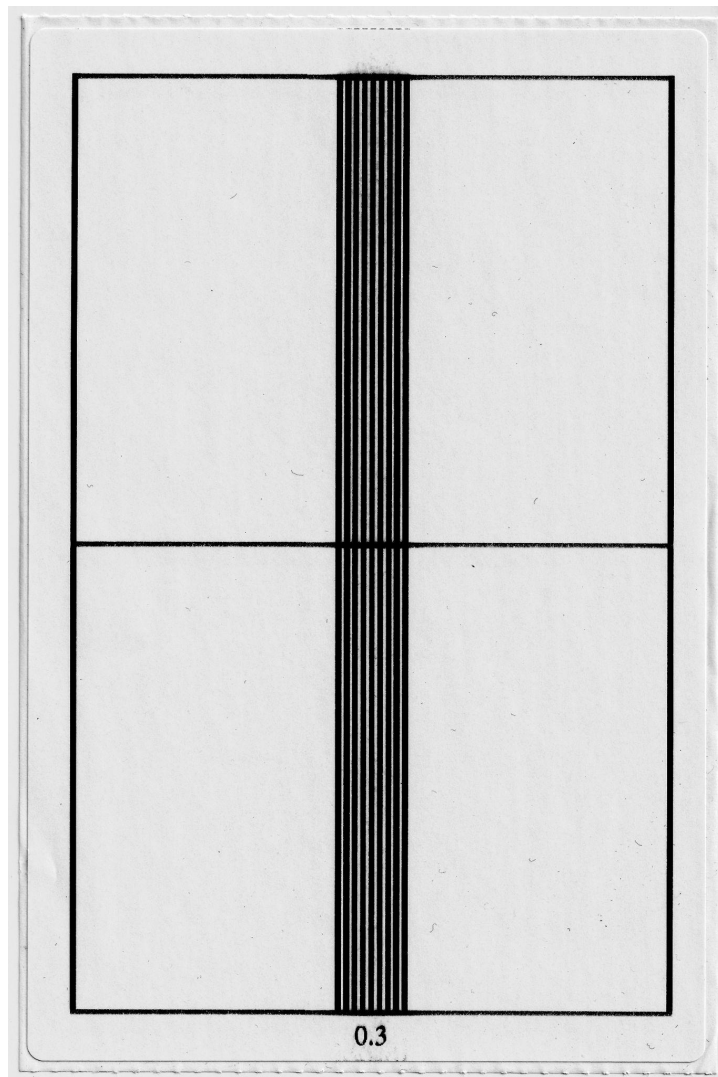

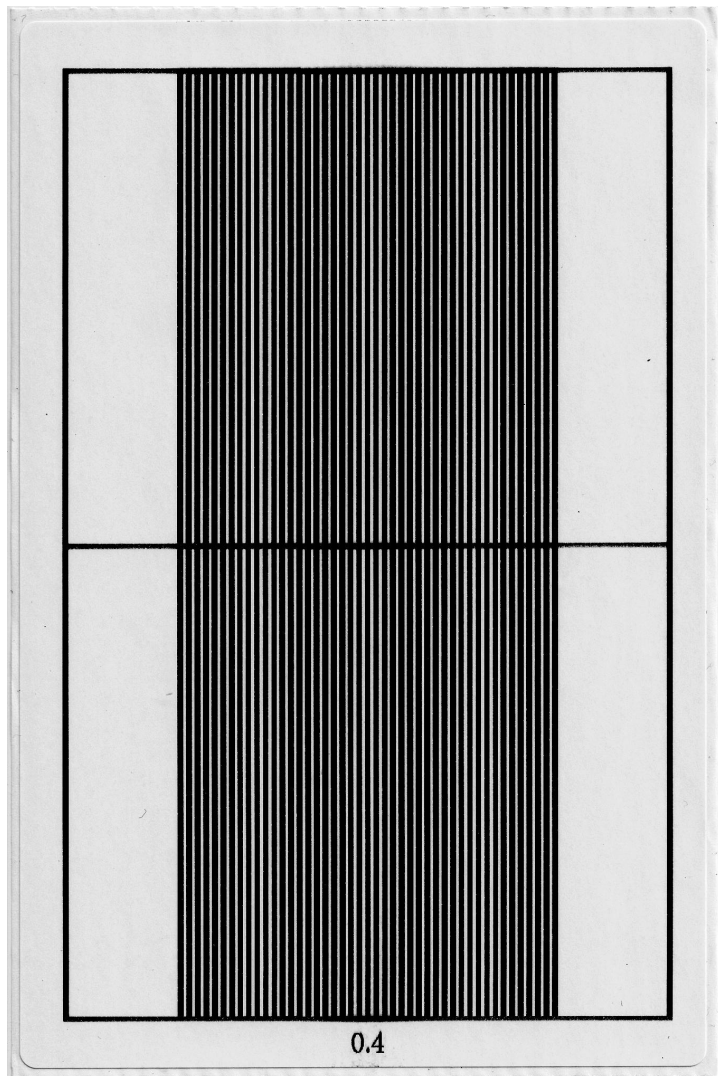


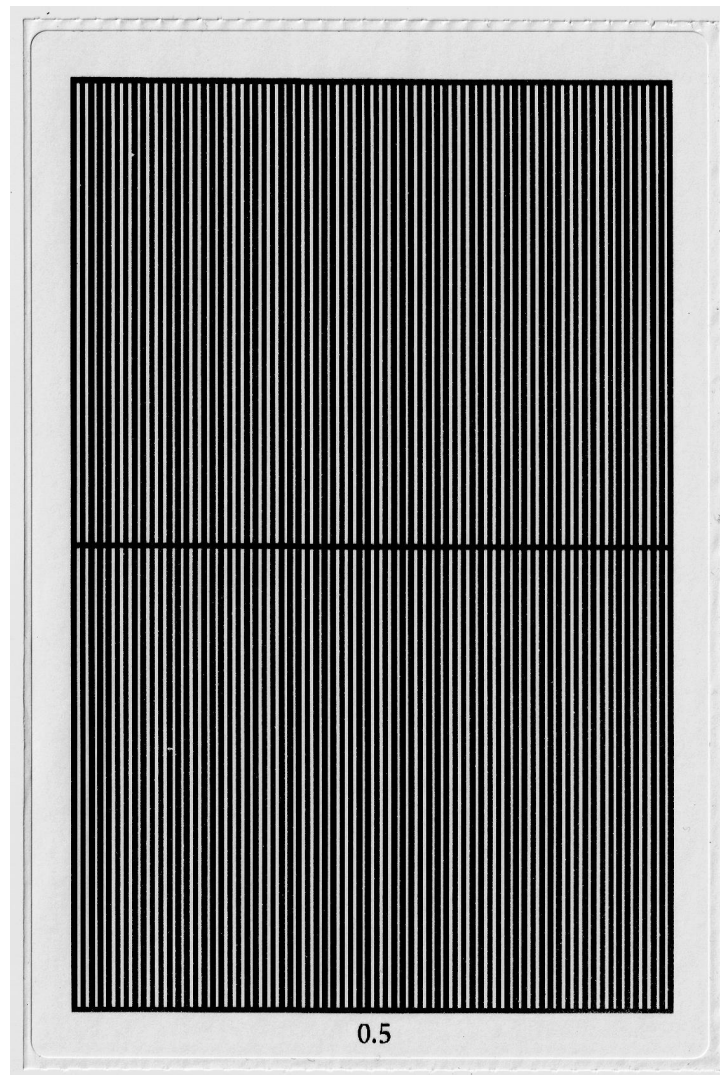


Like any line drawn in a diagrammatical context, it shows the abstract connection of two or more points. In a fundamental sense, this principle is at the very essence of everything we experience from the physical to the sublimely emotional.

What I feel is represented in this series of designs is that same principle but through our psychological links to the phenomena of reality. Specifically the connections we find between each other.

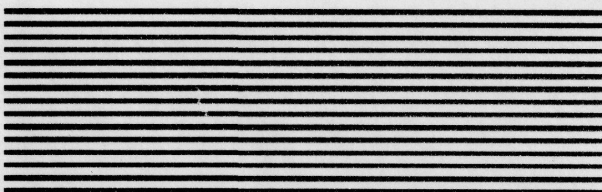
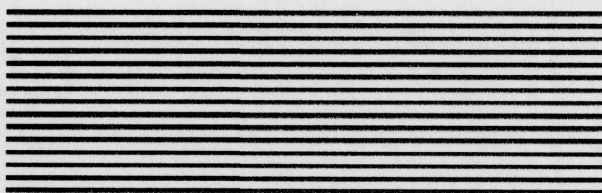
apply them to human behaviour too? God knows we know less about how humans act than what types of stars sit on the outside of our galaxy.



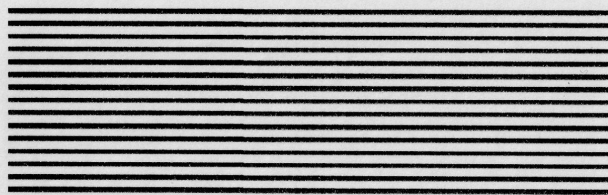
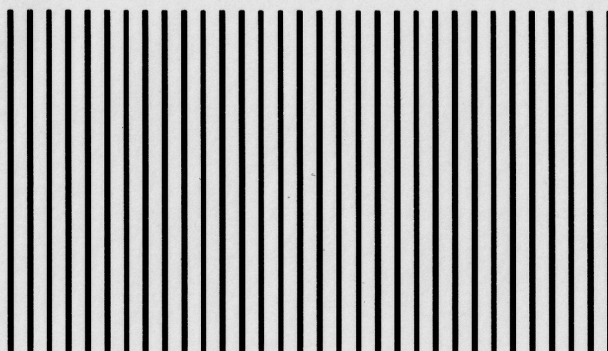
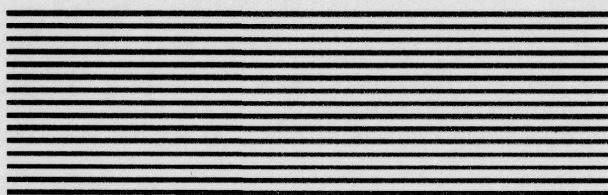


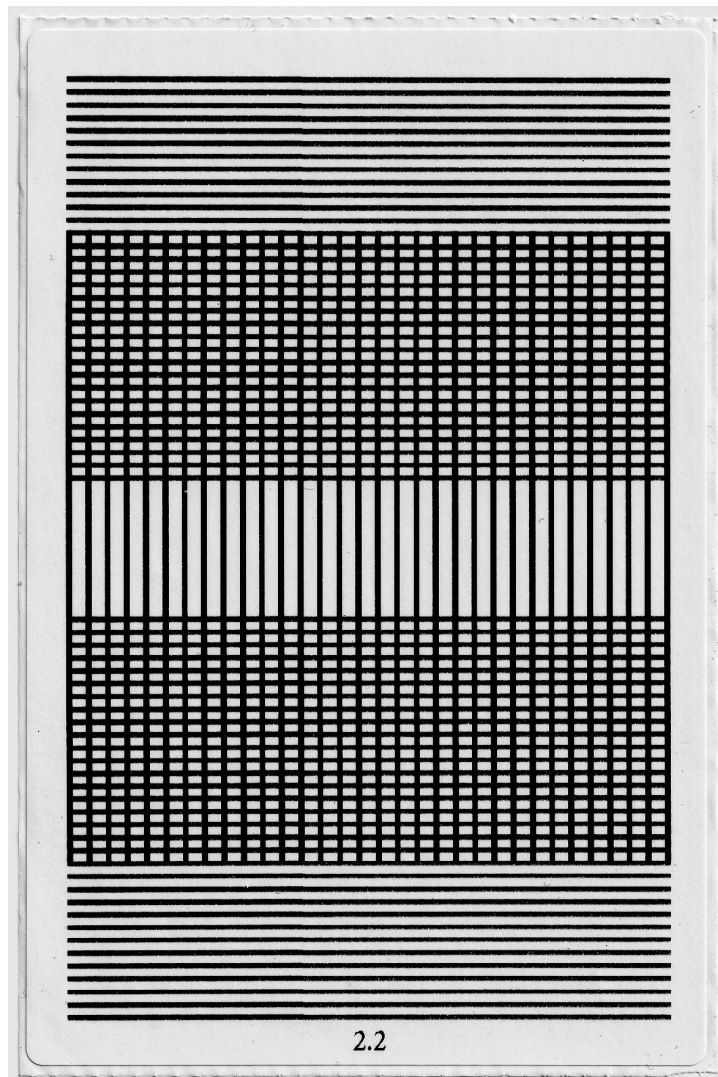

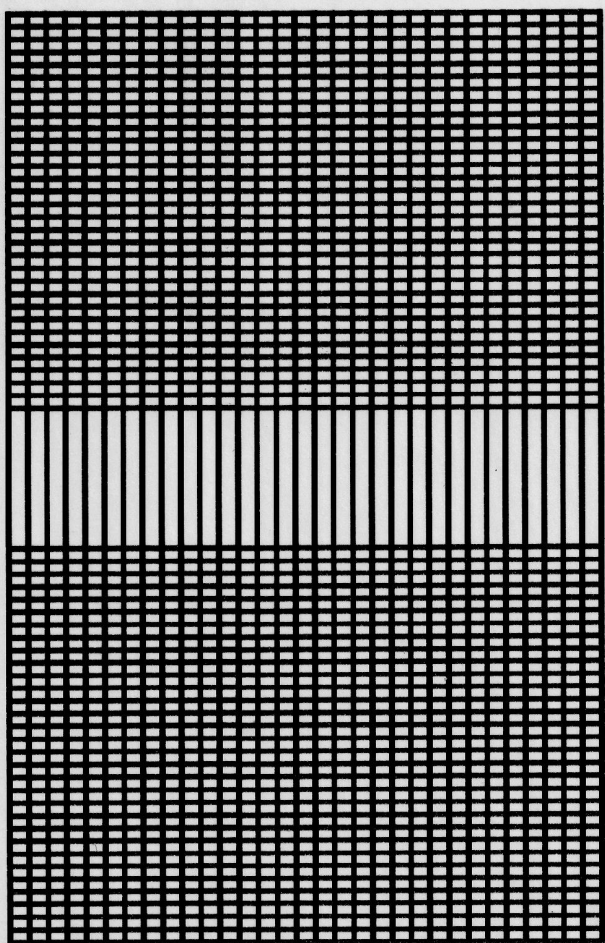
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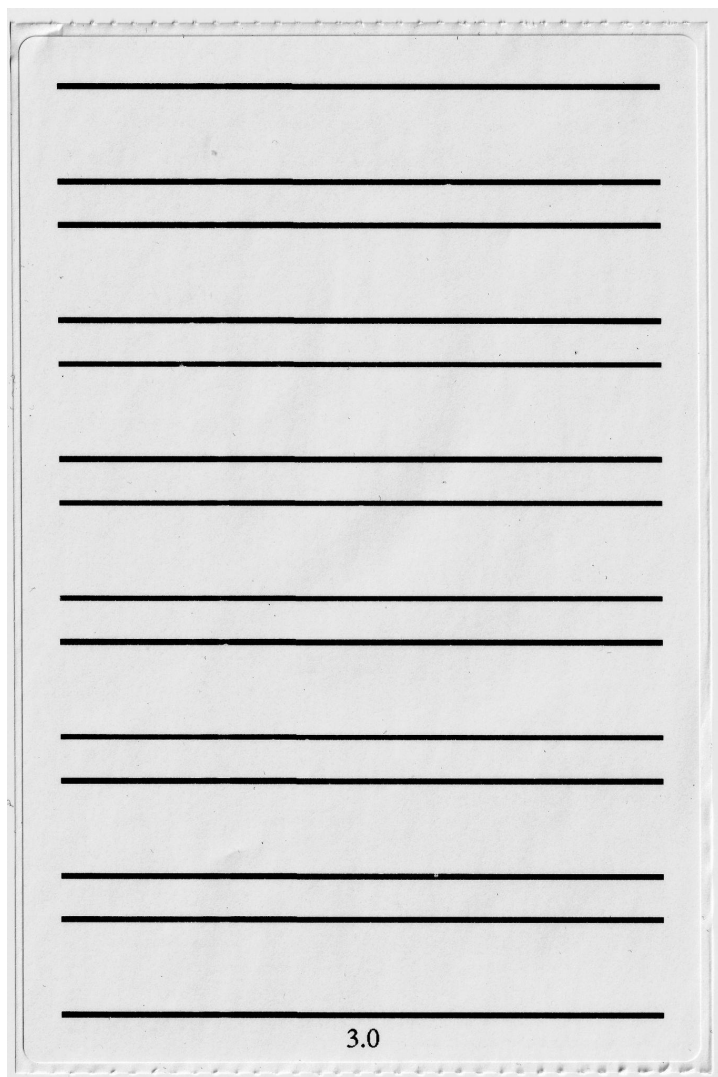


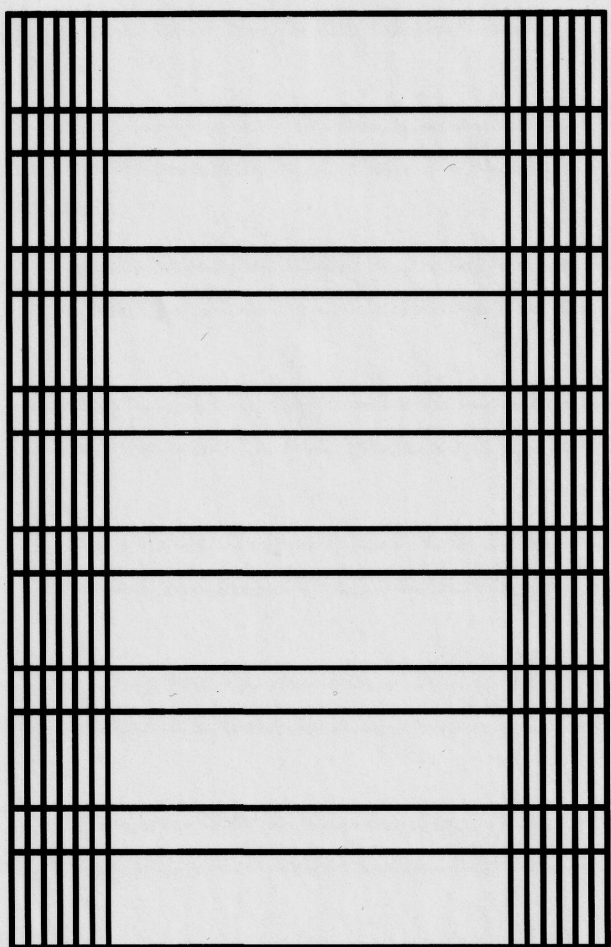


Each chapter is a progression through time - never really a regression which I see as an oversight on my part.

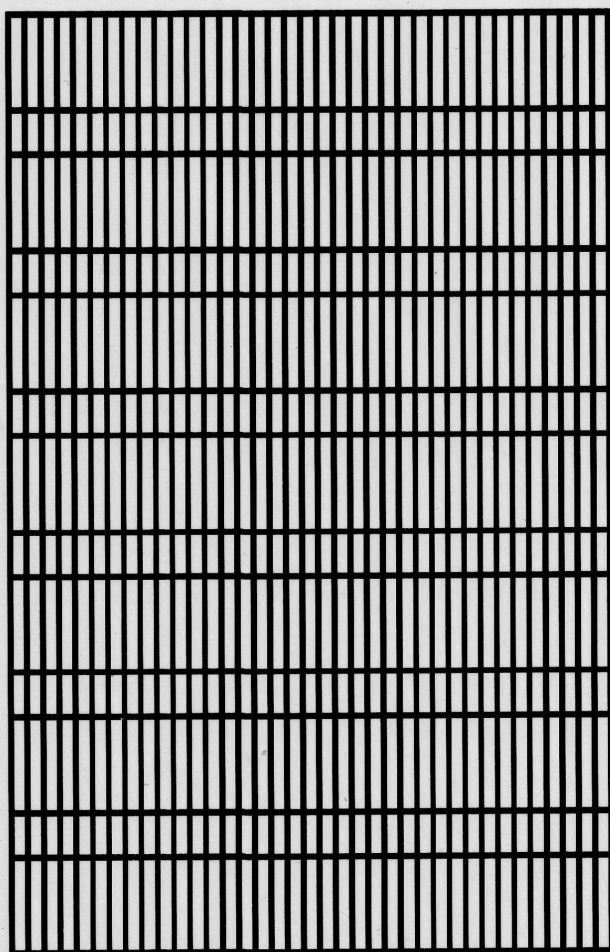

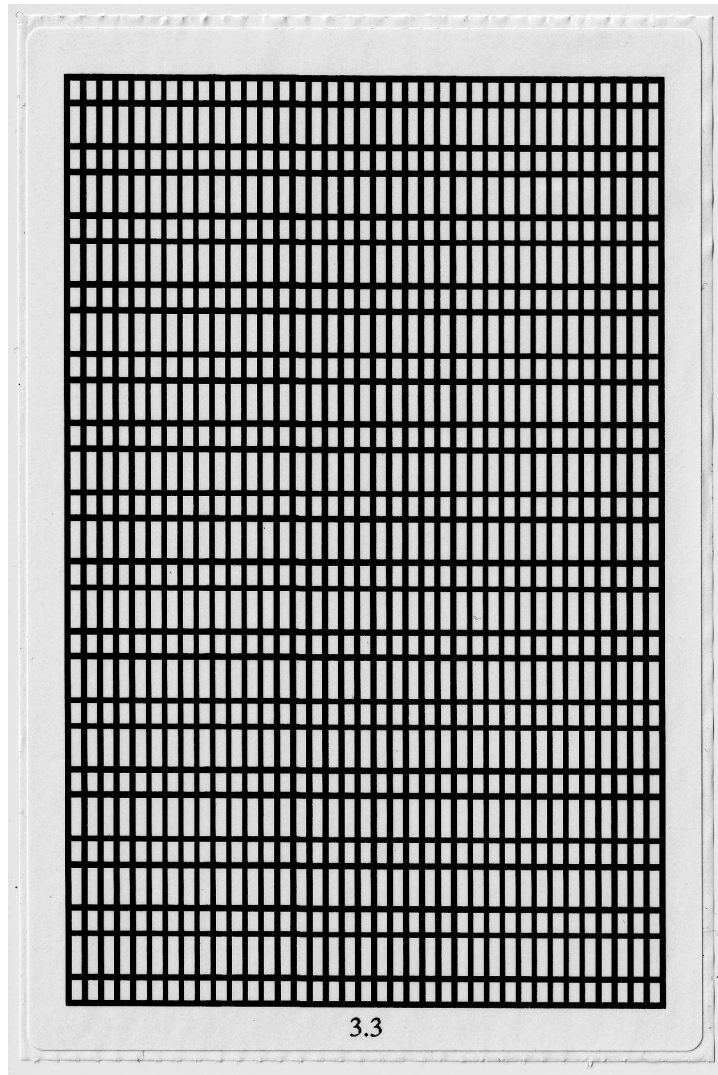
